Poland



- ❖ Poland is a country in Central Europe that has borders with Germany, the Czech Republic , Slovakia , Ukraine , Belarus, and the Baltic Sea.
- ❖ It is one of the largest countries in the world and the 9th largest in Europe. It has a population of over 38 million people.
- ❖ Poland is a unitary state divided into 16 administrative subdivisions, and its capital and largest city is Warsaw. Other big cities include Kraków, Wrocław, Poznań, Gdańsk and Szczecin.

Gorzów

- ❖ Gorzów is a city in western Poland, on the Warta river.
- ❖ Gorzów is known for its successful sportsmen, including Olympic and world champions and national representatives.
- ❖ The city of Gorzow boasts several interesting sights and attractions like Museum of Ancient Art and Jan Dekert Lubukie Museum.
- ❖ In the city, there are many places where you can meet other people, listen to music, exchange opinions or admire famous works of art. The BWA gallery exhibits the works of outstanding Polish artists.
- ❖ Jazz Club is one of the city's best showcases. It staged some of the best Polish jazz musicians.



Kraków

- ❖ Kraków is the second largest and one of the oldest cities in Poland.
- ❖ The city has a population of approximately 700,000.
- ❖ In 2000, Kraków was named European Capital of Culture. In 2013 Kraków was officially approved as a UNESCO City of Literature. The city hosted the World Youth Day in July 2016.



Wrocław

- ❖ Wrocław lies on the banks of the River Oder of Central Europe. The population of Wrocław is about 600,000.
- ❖ In 2016, the city was a European Capital of Culture and the World Book Capital. Also in this year, Wrocław hosted the Theatre Olympics, World Bridge Games and the European Film Awards. In 2017, the city is the host of the IFLA Annual Conference and the World Games.



Poznań

- ❖ Poznań is a city on the Warta river in west-central Poland. It is best known for its renaissance Old Town, destroyed during World War II and then rebuilt. The city population is about 550,000. Today, Poznań is an important cultural and business centre and one of Poland's most popular regions with many regional customs such as traditional Saint Martin's croissants.



Attractions in Poznań

- ❖ The Imperial Castle, popularly called Zamek, is a palace in Poznań, in Poland. It was constructed by Franz Schwechten for William II, German Emperor, with significant input from William himself.
- ❖ Lake Malta, known also as the Maltański Reservoir, is an artificial lake in Poznań, Poland. It was formed in 1952 as a result of the damming of the Cybina River.



Zielona Gora

- ❖ Zielona Gora is a wonderful city in the west of Poland with 140,000 inhabitants. The city is located 125 km from Poznań. It is one of the fastest developing urban centers in the country.

A Polish menu is constantly enriched with new flavours, sometimes even exotic.




IN POLAND YOU CAN EAT...
